

Fluorescent Bulbs and Ballasts

Fluorescent bulbs use only one-third as much electricity as regular incandescent bulbs. They also will last ten times longer than regular bulbs. They are a good choice in lighting, but must be disposed of correctly.

After August 1994, it has been illegal to dispose of fluorescent and high intensity discharge lamps with your household waste. These lamps must be managed separately because of their mercury content.

Dispose of fluorescent bulbs and ballasts at the following locations:
