MARTIN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
THURSDAY, DECEMBER 20, 2011
@ 9:00 A.M.

The regular meeting of the Martin County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Chairman Steve Pierce.

Commissioners present were Schmidtke, Donnelly, and Potter. Commissioner District No. 1 is vacant. Also present were Scott Higgins, Martin County Coordinator, James Forshee, Martin County Auditor/Treasurer, Kevin Peyman, Martin County Highway Engineer, Terry Viesselman, Martin County Attorney, Jennifer Brookens, Sentinel Newspaper, Rod Halvorsen, KSUM/KFMC Radio, Julie Walters, Administrative Assistant, and members of staff and public.

Motion by Commissioner Schmidtke, seconded by Commissioner Donnelly, Be It Resolved that the Martin County Board of Commissioners, hereby approve the agenda with the following addition: 8.22 Consider Purchase of Pickup Truck – Planning and Zoning Department. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Commissioner Potter, seconded by Commissioner Donnelly, Be It Resolved that the Martin County Board of Commissioners, hereby approve the minutes of the December 1, 2011 regular Board of Commissioners meeting; and approve the minutes of the December 1, 2011 Truth in Taxation meeting. Carried unanimously.

Terry Viesselman, Martin County Attorney, was present.

Chairman Pierce introduced the permit request for the various solid waste and recycling haulers stating that that have met the criteria to receive a license for collection and transportation of solid waste and recycling in Martin County and noted the businesses are renewals with no new licensing this year; and have met the requirements for licensure in Martin County.

RESOLUTION

ISSUANCE OF TOBACCO LICENSES FOR 2012

WHEREAS, the County of Martin, MN (County) has established a Tobacco Ordinance (Ordinance) relating to the sale, possession, and use of tobacco in Martin County and to reduce the illegal sale, possession, and use of such items to and by minors, along with compliance with Minnesota Statutes and Rules; and

WHEREAS, applications for a tobacco license to sell tobacco shall be made through the County and its required forms as established by the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Martin County Board of Commissioners (Board) may either approve or deny the license, or delay it for such reasonable period of time as necessary to complete any investigation of the application or the applicant it deems necessary. If the Board approves the application, the County Coordinator shall issue the license. If the application is denied, notice of the denial shall be given to the applicant along with notice of the applicants right to appeal the Board's decision; and,

WHEREAS, all licenses shall be valid under the Ordinance for one calendar year from the date of issuance; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Martin County Board of Commissioners, hereby approve and authorize tobacco licenses for the following Retail Establishments, and valid for the year 2012:

Kevin Peyman, Martin County Highway Engineer, presented his recommendation to purchase a 2012 budgeted pickup truck from Fairmont Ford in the amount of \$19,817.00 plus tax (\$1,288.11). Peyman reviewed bids received stating that the quotes included the price from the state contract. Peyman stated Fairmont Ford came in slightly under the State Contract Price due to extra discounts that applied to the purchase. Peyman went on to state that in recent conversations with the Auditor/Treasurer, the Drainage Administration Office is looking for a pickup to haul their ATV for performing ditch inspections and other Ditch work. Peyman stated that instead of trading in or selling an older model Highway Fleet pickup, Peyman recommended transferring a 2006 Chevrolet pickup with 98,000 miles to the Ditch Administration Office. Peyman noted he is willing to work with the Auditor/Treasurer's Office to determine a fair price for transfer of the 2006 Chevrolet pickup. Peyman went on to note that the 2006 Chevrolet pickup should give the Drainage Administration Office quite a few good years of use. Peyman continued that the Highway Department would have another 2006 Chevrolet pickup with 110,000 miles coming up for replacement in 2012 and suggested if another county department needed a vehicle, he could go ahead and purchase a second vehicle from the bids received. Motion by Commissioner Potter, seconded by Commissioner Schmidtke, Be It Resolved that the Martin County Board of Commissioners, upon the recommendation of the County Engineer, hereby approves the purchase of a 2012 Fairmont Ford F-150 Pickup from Fairmont Ford in the amount of \$19,817.00 plus tax. Carried unanimously.

Motion by Commissioner Schmidtke, seconded by Commissioner Potter, Be It Resolved that the Martin County Board of Commissioners, hereby approve the transfer of a 2006 Chevrolet Pickup (Unit #) with 98,000 miles from the Martin County Highway Department to the Ditch Administration Office, and to authorize the Martin County Auditor/Treasurer and County Highway Engineer to determine a fair purchase price. Carried unanimously.

Peyman next presented his recommendation to purchase a 2012 John Deere 2-wheel drive mower with 72" deck and 4-post canopy at the State Contract Price of \$17,000. Peyman stated the mower the Highway Department currently has is a 2001 with about 1800 hours and is used pretty much all summer mowing all five County parks. This past year there was a major repair on the mower and the unit was out of commission for approximately three weeks and needed to rent a tractor and mower, which added cost to the budget. Peyman continued suggesting that in the future, whenever a new park mower is needed, we'll figure out what the trade value would be for that equipment, and the Highway Department would reimburse the Parks for the mower unit, which would be used to mow the highway lot. The other benefit would be if we have another breakdown on the Park mower we wouldn't have to try and find a rental and scramble to figure out how to get the parks mowed. After review of all bids, which included a price for the used mower from the Martin County Fair Board, Peyman recommended the purchase of a 2012 John Deere 26 h.p. mower, 2-wheel drive mower in the amount of \$17,000. Peyman noted this recommendation was unanimous with the Park Board as well when we talked about it at the last meeting.

Motion by Commissioner Schmidtke, seconded by Commissioner Potter, Be It Resolved that the Martin County Board of Commissioners, upon the recommendation of the Martin County Park Board and upon the recommendation of the County Engineer, hereby approve and authorize the purchase of a 2012 John Deere 2-wheel drive Tractor/Mower at the state contract price of \$17,000.00 and includes a 4-post canopy and 72” mower deck. Carried unanimously.

Billeye Rabbe, Solid Waste Coordinator for Martin and Faribault Counties was present and stated that she wanted it noted in the official Board minutes that she does not have the required paperwork or the check from Waste Management for the 2012 garbage and recycle licenses and should note approval for Waste Management contingent upon receiving the required paperwork. The Board Chair so noted this issue.

Peyman concluded with a brief department update including catching up on various projects around the shop that normally are put aside due to clearing of snow in a normal winter.

Jeff Markquart, Martin County Sheriff, was present to recommend hiring Chuck Poppe as part-time Deputy/ Courtroom Security for the Martin County Sheriff's Office. Poppe is a full time licensed peace officer. Markquart stated this position would be on an as needed basis strictly when court is in session.

Motion by Commissioner Donnelly, seconded by Commissioner Schmidtke, Be It Resolved that the Martin County Board of Commissioners, hereby approve and authorize the hire of Chuck Poppe as part-time Deputy and Courtroom Security for the Martin County Sheriff's Office on an as needed basis at \$17.50/hour effective December 20, 2011, not eligible for benefits. Carried unanimously.

Markquart continued with his recommendation to hire Josh Nelson as part-time Deputy to fill the part-time position of Chris Vasvick when he was hired full-time. Nelson will be trained on the road to help fill shifts so we'd be back to our staffing of two part-time positions. Also the two part-time road guys will be trained to work with the courts on an as needed basis also.

Motion by Commissioner Potter, seconded by Commissioner Schmidtke, Be It Resolved that the Martin County Board of Commissioners, hereby approve and authorize the hire of Josh Nelson as part-time Deputy for the Martin County Sheriff's Office at \$17.50/hour effective December 20, 2011, not eligible for benefits and contingent upon successful background check. Carried unanimously.

Markquart presented and reviewed an agreement with TurnKey Corrections for inmate commissary vending service. TurnKey offers a full service solution to all inmate account management including cashless vending, canteen, commissary accounts and more into one system. Customizable solutions include inmate banking, transaction control, and reporting. Installation costs will be offset by revenue earned by the County from fees charged for the various services. Markquart stated that the handling of inmate money is handled through various steps and employees and with this new system would help to eliminate a lot of that labor and the possibilities of errors. TurnKey would install a vending machine where it is accessible for all the inmates, each inmate would receive a swipe card to use to purchase toiletries and snacks.

Commissioner Pierce stated this vending service was discussed at the Building Committee meeting on December 19, 2011 and everything seems to make sense. However, inquired if the software installation been discussed with our IT Department?

Steve McDonald, MIS Director, was present and stated TurnKey hasn't gotten back to him with question he had and requested that this purchase be placed on hold in order to get the information of what is needed to support and install the proposed vending system. After further discussion,

Consensus of the Board is to table the Inmate Commissary Vending Service Agreement with TurnKey Corrections until further information is received and the IT Dept. has time to review the what technology is needed for the project.

Markquart presented and reviewed the Inmate Nursing Services Contract stating the proposed 2012 contract calls for regular nursing services at \$36.00 per hour (a 0% increase over 2011 contract price); and that on-call services and emergency call back fees and language remain the same as with the 2011 contract.

Motion by Commissioner Donnelly, seconded by Commissioner Potter, Be It Resolved that the Martin County Board of Commissioners, hereby approve and authorize the Board Chair to sign the Nursing Services Agreement between Joy Pousch, RN, BSN and the Martin County Sheriff's Office (Martin County) to provide regular and on-call services; at an hourly rate of \$36.00 per hour and on-call services of \$90.00 per month. Carried unanimously.

Markquart stated the Sheriff's Office has submitted the annual Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) for Federal Fiscal Year 2011 and has received notification of approval in the amount of \$19,458. Grant dollars received go toward expenses for Emergency Management in the Sheriff's Office.

Markquart concluded with an office updated including current jail count of twenty-two (22) in-house, twelve (12) out-of-county, and nine (9) on Electronic Home Monitoring (EHM).

Bev Snow, FMJ Drug Court Coordinator, updated the Board stating the BJA FY2009 Recovery Act Assistance to Rural Law Enforcement to Combat Crime and Drugs: Enhancing Rural Corrections, Detention & Jail Operations grant funding will end on March 31, 2012. Snow stated that grant funding has paid for one and one-half corrections officers and mental health services in the Martin County Jail since the

inception of the grant. The mental health nursing services will be done the end of 2011; however a therapist has been hired through Sioux Trails Mental Health Center with funding received from a \$1.6 million grant for the district to cover co-occurring disorders with Drug Court clients in Brown, Nicollet, Watonwan, Faribault, Martin, Jackson, and Blue Earth Counties.

Snow reminded the Board of the graduation ceremony at 12:30 p.m. today from the Adult Drug Court. This will be its 36th graduate from the program; and we are also celebrating the Drug Court's five year anniversary.

Snow concluded stating that somewhere between March and July, 2012, she will officially retire. When asked by Commissioners what will happen to Drug Court, Snow stated we have a great team in place and have been working on sustainability and looking at possible team members that would be interested in taking my position. Drug Court is here to stay. When I implemented Drug Court, I implemented it for many, many years.

Forshee, Martin County Auditor/Treasurer, stated that funding for the one and one-half corrections officers has been included in the County's 2012 budget.

Scott Higgins, Martin County Coordinator, presented the Continuation Grant and resolution with the Office of Justice Programs. Federal funds for this grant contract are provided under the Ongoing Crime Victim Services for the purpose of providing supplemental funding to aid in the provision of direct services to victims of crime. State funds for this grant contract are provided for the purpose of providing crime victim services to victims of domestic violence, general crime services, and sexual assault services. Higgins stated the contract is effective October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2012 and is in the amount of \$83,584.

Addendum #1 (Contract Term for 2010-2012)

This agreement made and entered into by and between Fairlakes Transportation, Inc, 530 Kings Road, Fairmont, MN 56031 hereinafter called the "Contractor" and Martin County, MN hereinafter the "County" amend this agreement for the contract period from January

1, 2010-December 31, 2012 and mutually modify the portion of the agreement as follows:

“From time to time it may be necessary to amend the amount the contract due to changes in the service hours (more or less) based on the county’s needs. To accommodate those changes, Martin County, with the approval of the Martin County Board of Commissioners, may adjust the amount to be paid (more or less) to the contractor throughout the term of the contract. Any changes in hours of service, resulting in changes in payments to the contractor must be supported by monthly invoices for the hours of service provided. Payment to the contractor will not be made until monthly invoice is received.”

The remainder of the contract remains in full force and effect with only the modifications mutually agreed upon as stated above.

The Agency (County) and Contractor have executed this amendment on the date below written to be effective December 20, 2011. This amendment is valid when duly signed and attached to the original agreement.

James Forshee, Martin County Auditor/Treasurer, stated the Auditor/Treasurer’s Office has been in contact with those who have non -sufficient fund (NSF) checks written to the county; however, have determined that these NSF checks totaling \$361.60 are uncollectible. Forshee stated policy has changed now that when NSF checks are received for Parks or Transit, the respective Departments are to be notified right away so that they can work to collect the funds, due to the fact that they may be able to collect from the individuals themselves. Forshee noted the Auditor/Treasurer’s Office actively works to contact the individuals for collections and talk with their banks. Some are successful and some are not.

Scott Higgins, Martin County Coordinator, stated that Martin County Transit is still trying to collect outstanding checks on the list from Maureen Pina, Matthew Schiszler, Christina Canterbury, and Heather Lawton totaling \$183.25; and that the Board’s action allows more time for collection, but if the Coordinator deems unsuccessful to allow these checks to be written off as well.

Motion by Commissioner Schmidtke, seconded by Commissioner Donnelly, Be It Resolved that the Martin County Board of Commissioners, upon the recommendation of the Martin County Auditor/Treasurer’s Office, hereby deems the following checks as uncollectible for a total amount of \$361.60: Alyssa K.
